

Bella Vista and Kangara Apportionment Proceedings

I refer to your letter dated 24 February 2014 in relation to the Supreme Court of Victoria Proceedings Nos. S CI 2013 1477 and S CI 2013 1478 (respectively, the Bella Vista Rights Proceedings and the Kangara Rights Proceedings).

As the Bella Vista Rights Proceedings and Kangara Rights Proceedings are currently the subject of Court proceedings, processes appear to be in place for providing disclosure to growers and for dissenting growers to raise concerns with the Court, ASIC does not consider it necessary to be involved in the processes, or to participate in the hearings identified in your letter. Further ASIC does not consider it necessary to sight the deeds of compromise.

We would however appreciate you notifying ASIC of any significant change to the proposed compromise and of the outcomes of the hearings identified in your letter.
