The above table sets out the expected harvesting completion dates for the twelve Timbercorp Forestry Schemes (eleven MIS and one Private Offer Scheme) currently in existence.

The harvest of each scheme is expected to take place over a number of years (e.g. the 1999 Eucalypts Scheme will be harvested over a period of eight years). Maintenance and rental costs associated with each scheme will reduce over time as the trees on the properties within each scheme are harvested.

The harvesting schedule is affected by several factors, including, but not limited to:

- Global demand for woodchips
- Shipping schedules
- Location

- Site seasonality / weather
- Site access

In its current position, the Forestry Schemes have:

- No cash
- No ability to pay leases that fell due 30/6/09
- No maintenance being undertaken
- Reduced treefarm staff
